"Urb.Energy" – Energy Efficiency and Integrated Urban Development

Urb.Energy is a transnational European cooperation project part-financed by the European Union within the Baltic Sea Region Programme 2007 – 2013. The Urb.Energy project started in January 2009 will run for a total of three years. Urb.Energy builds on the results of the BSR Interreg III B project "BEEN - Baltic Energy Efficiency Network for the Building Stock". It combines the approach of the energy efficient refurbishment of residential buildings with integrated urban development concepts, modernisation of energy supply infrastructures, improvement of residential environment and the identification of innovative financing instruments.

Urb.Energy brings together 15 partners from Germany, Poland, Lithuania, Latvia, Estonia and Belarus that represent key actors in the respective national activities aimed at energy efficient settlement structures. In the project, current approaches to the sustainable development of urban neighbourhoods are examined and integrated urban development strategies are prepared for selected target areas. In addition, the project will develop innovative funding schemes to finance the activities concerned, taking into account existing funding possibilities. The project partners are supported by a strong network of 20 associated organisations consisting of the responsible ministries, city administrations and relevant stakeholders from the fields of housing administration, energy and financing.
