Background and objective of the event

Reducing energy consumption and CO₂-emissions by more efficient energy use is among the main goals of the European Union. The EU Energy Policy underlines that especially urban areas and in particular the enhancement of energy performance in the building sector offer high potentials to realise energy savings. At the same time the further application of renewable energy resources to supply for example residential areas with heating energy is required. The energy supply of cities has to be seen in the context with the endogenous potentials of the hinterland.

Hence, the local and regional level play a key role to reach the 'EU 20-20-20' objectives: On the one hand it is one of the most important fields of activity to implement sustainable energy solutions and on the other hand municipalities as well as local and regional authorities have an important coordinating and steering role.

The informational event "sustainable energy solutions in the urban and regional context – reflections on EU support" aims to discuss innovative approaches in the field of greenhouse gas reduction and to assess the implication on the European policy level as well as reflect on the strategy 'Energy 2020', the 'Energy Efficiency Plan 2011' and the existing EU support (e.g. by structural funds). With the help of specific experiences of three INTERREG IVB projects – addressing the building, the urban and the regional level – the event is dedicated to initiate an exchange between experts from European Commission, the European Parliament, representatives from cities and regions as well as other relevant European stakeholders on the question:

How to promote the CO₂ reduction in our cities and municipalities in broader scale?
